#### Dear Colleagues,

Welcome Back! I hope everyone had a restful and recuperative winter break. As you know, all instruction at PAU will be remote for the first two weeks of classes. We will resume in person instruction for residential and hyflex classes on Monday, January 24th. We are continuing to monitor the current surge in cases and will make adjustments to keep our community safe.

As you may have read in today's email from Dean Shepard, for winter quarter all students who go to a PAU facility are required to submit proof of full vaccination before they will be permitted on campus. This communication is linked here for your review.

Going forward, all PAU employees will be required to show proof that they have been fully vaccinated whether they work on campus or remotely. According to the CDC's guidance, being fully vaccinated means, 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine. There will be additional communication from the Human Resources department regarding where to upload your vaccination cards.
