Marriage, Child, and Family (MCFC) Counseling Specialty

The M.A. in Counseling Program at Palo Alto University is proud to offer two CACREP accredited specialties. This statement highlights relevant program and student outcomes for the MCFC specialty area.

Graduation and Completion Rates-2018-2019

- 65 students graduated from the Marriage, Child, and Family Counseling specialty area in the 2018-2019 academic year.
- This number represents an 84% on-time completion rate based on an anticipated enrollment period of 2.5 years.

Licensure Exam Pass Rates

The table below identifies the pass rates for PAU graduates of the MCFC specialty seeking licensure as a Marriage and Family Therapist (MFT) as required by the California Board of Behavioral Sciences (BBS). For all test takers for the past three years, the pass percentage is 86%, which is 20% higher than the California average for the identified tests.
