Full-time Scholar Educator Faculty Positions in the Department of Counseling – Internal Candidates Only

Palo Alto University (PAU) invites applications for up to two scholar educator faculty positions for the Department of Counseling at the rank of Assistant Professor for an appointment starting Fall 2020. One of the positions needs to be able to teach some courses on one of PAU campuses. Only internal candidates should apply.

The Department of Counseling seeks faculty with teaching, scholarship, and/or clinical practice expertise in one or more of the following areas (alpha order): clinical mental health, integration of multicultural and social justice efforts in counseling, and marriage and family.

The position of scholar educator involves teaching courses, advising students, and engaging in department and university service. The University seeks candidates who are current in the related disciplinary literature and in the relevant research on teaching and/or clinical practice. Scholar Educators are to actively participate in how that knowledge is applied so that PAU students are afforded instruction that leverages high impact practices for student engagement and success. Successful candidates must be able to engage and support students of color, women, LGBTQ+ students, and other underrepresented groups, and will be interested in participating in initiatives that aim to increase inclusivity.

Qualifications:

- Doctoral degree in Counseling Education and Supervision from a CACREP-accredited program, or have a related doctoral degree and have been previously employed as a full-time faculty member in a counselor education program;
- Licensed or license-eligible as a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor;
- Potential for excellence in teaching in online and residential formats;
- Active engagement in the field of counseling through participation in counseling professional associations;
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills in video conferencing, in-person interactions, email and chat;
- Competency in facilitating conversations related to systemic and cultural oppression;
- Demonstrated experience teaching or as a counselor with underrepresented groups; and
- Minimum of two years of experience teaching in counseling education.
