To be successful as a mental health therapist, you should have working knowledge of theory and application of Cognitive-Behavioral Treatment, the ability to organize and run individual and group sessions and complete at minimum your master's degree in a related field. The ideal individual for this role should be a compassionate problem solver who feels comfortable collaborating with other mental health experts.

Posting: Paid Post-Doctoral Position – Recovery Clinic

Introduction: The WIRC is a community mental health clinic that trains first-year and advanced doctoral students to provide psychotherapy to clients with co-occurring substance and mental health issues. The students treat mostly high-risk clients who have experienced severe and complex trauma, incarceration, lack of housing, and/or hospitalizations as well as substance use disorders in either active use or in recovery.

The postdoc provides weekly group supervision to first-year students; provides some individual supervision; teaches some didactic sections; works with advanced students to prepare didactic lesson plans; participates in documentation review; collaborates with the clinic's director in the overall administration of the clinic; and offers consultation as needed. Aspects of the role can be flexible depending on the strengths and interests of the applicant.

The position is 18 – 32 hours per week. Approximately 6 of the total hours are fixed, and the remaining time can be scheduled flexibly. Supervision by a licensed psychologist will be provided from an integrated, primarily psychodynamic, perspective. Please send CV and letter of interest to cbelkin@wi.edu to apply.
