Introduction: KCW Psychological Services (KCW PS) is a unique practice servicing clients in California, New York, New Jersey, and Maryland via telehealth therapy. We are growing and need to hire another mental health therapist/clinician!

This is a part-time position, so the therapist must have another job outside of working at KCW Psychological Services. We are looking to hire someone who is a good fit for our practice and our clients.

This is an ideal position for someone who is working elsewhere, as their caseload would build over time (average 3-6 months). This is also a great position for someone who is interested in working with BIPOC clients in a private practice setting but is not interested in performing administrative duties (e.g., billing, marketing/advertising, other practice management duties...etc). This position could be ideal for someone who wants to provide therapy to clients making their own schedule, who wants to build up a caseload, and make additional income seeing clients. Licensed therapists have the flexibility to schedule clients during the day and evening hours. Psychology Associates (CA only) psychologists can have individualized schedules as well (to be discussed with the Practice Director). Ideally, we want a therapist who is looking to remain with the practice on a long-term basis.

We pride ourselves on being BIPOC tele-mental health therapists that want to create a private practice community of these types of therapists who facilitate hope and healing through mental health and wellness practices/techniques. We are focused on providing services to people who identify as being within the BIPOC, women and men of color, LGBTQIA+ communities, as well as other underrepresented groups in the mental health space. Introduction: Post-Doctoral Fellows will have the opportunity to work therapeutically with dedicated scientists, physicians, faculty, and staff who strive to make the world a better place. FSAP provides counseling and consultation services to the employees at UCSF and is NOT a student counseling center.

FSAP is an internal Employee Assistance Program that provides individual counseling and organizational consulting services to the employee population at UCSF. Since 1995, FSAP's dynamic training program has helped train highly skilled clinical psychologists in preparation for licensure and career development. Our training program offers a unique opportunity for postdocs to refine their short-term counseling and coaching skills, as well as to learn specialized skills in organizational consultation and intervention. Many of our trainees go on to work in hospital and academic settings, Employee Assistance Programs (EAPs), and in private practice where they provide consultation to business and academic organizations.

Fellows function as integral members of our clinical team. They provide ~15 hours of 1-1 clinical work per week (NO after-hour emergency on-call required) in addition to organizational consultation opportunities. An interest in developing organizational psychology skills in addition to 1-1 therapeutic skills is required.
